



A) Please confirm this is the first and only time you answer this survey. <sup>768</sup> responses



**Interpretation** :From the Survey it is found that 94% of respondents have responded for the first and only time.




Interpretation :Out of total responses, 67.7% are male whereas 32.3% are female.



**Interpretation** :It is found that maximum respondents are pursuing Bachelor's degree that is 83.6% and 14% are pursuing Master's degree.


What subject area are you currently pursuing?



How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 772 responses




How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 770 responses




Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. 771 responses


The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as 773 responses


The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students. 770 responses

The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.





Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes. 768 responses





The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. <sup>766</sup> responses





The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges. <sup>766</sup> responses





Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them. <sup>769</sup> responses








Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities. <sup>764</sup> responses


Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.


