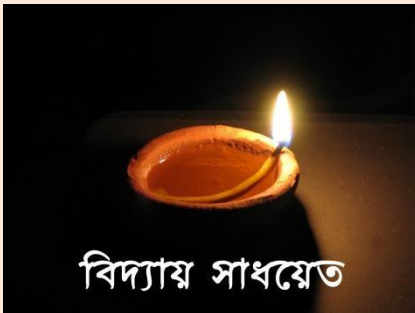

CAMPUS

The sprawling college campus extends along the National Highway No. 37 at the eastern end of Nagaon Municipality. 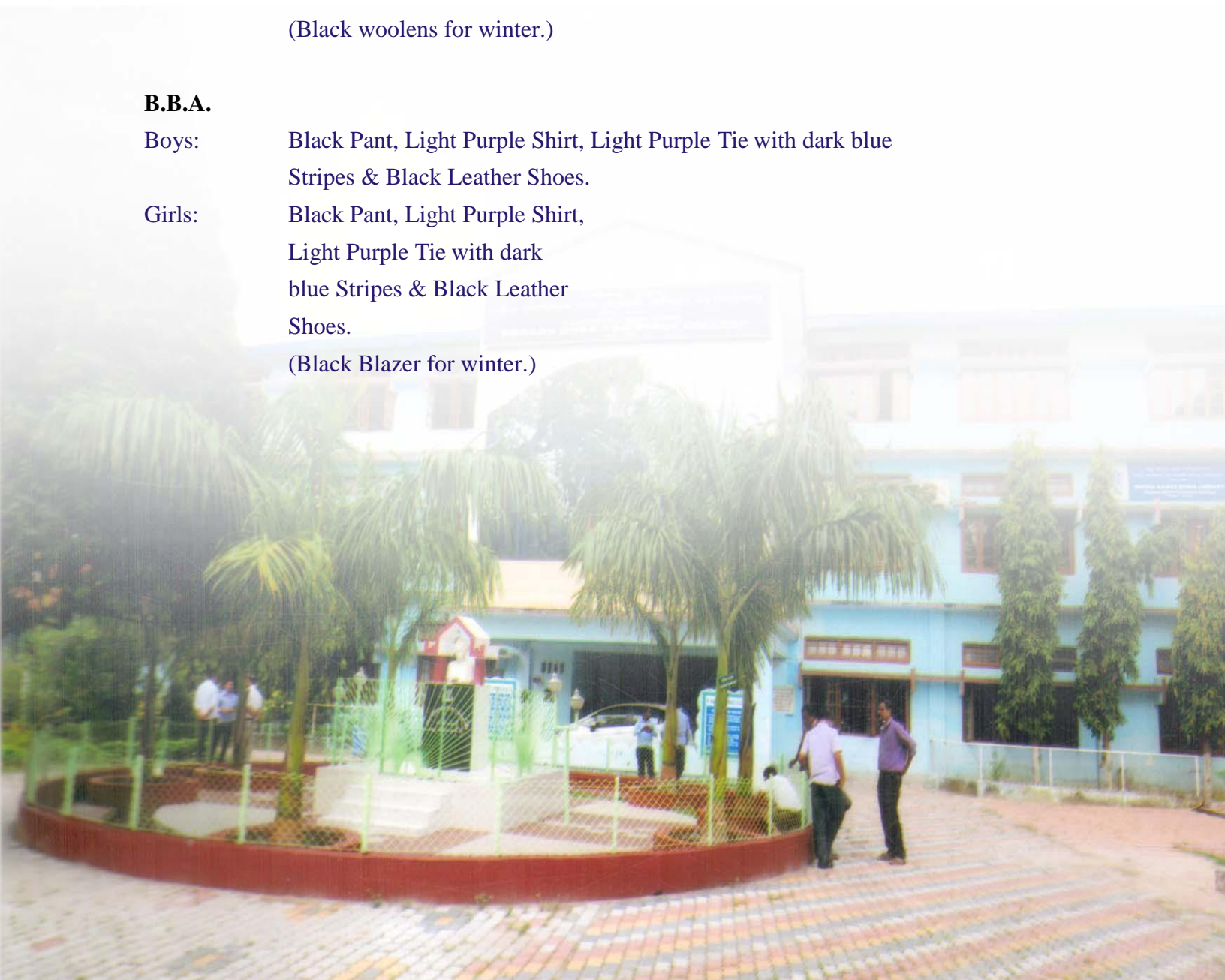

COURSES OF STUDY

Under Graduate CBCS (UGCBCS) Programmes

The college offers the following Courses:

1. B. Com.(Semester system with major/honours in Accountancy, Finance and Management under Gauhati University and CBCS of NEP, 2020).
2. BBA (3 years semester course under Gauhati University) (CBCS of NEP, 2020)

Post Graduate (PG) Course:

M.Com. (Two years semester course under Gauhati University and CBCS of NEP, 2020).

Provided that:

- i) After completion of 3 year degree course, a student can take admission in 1st Year M. Com. and study 2 years course (4 Semesters).
- ii) After completion of 4 year degree course, a student can get admitted directly in 2nd Year M. Com. (3rd Semester) Programme and study for one year (2 Semesters).

Career Oriented Courses:

- a. Travel and Tourism Management.
- b. Insurance Marketing.
- c. Sales and Marketing Management.

NB: Apart from the above courses the college authority is planning to start a few Add-on Courses from the coming academic session.

ADMISSION

(For attention of Guardians and Students)

- Please go through the prospectus carefully before signing the Admission Form.
- Students will be selected strictly on the basis of merit.
- Seats are reserved for students belonging to SC / ST / MOBC / OBC / Physically handicapped as per govt. Rules.
- Admission to the College Hostel will be on the basis of merit after the college admission.
- The following documents should be produced at the time of admission:

- i. Original Mark sheet, Certificate of the last qualifying examination, Caste Certificate, Gap Certificate if any. (Provisional certificate will not be accepted)
 - ii. Income certificate of parents must be produced if opting for free admission scheme of Assam government.
- Filling up the registration form immediately after the admission which is mandatory for registration under G.U.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- **B.Com:** Candidates who pass H.S. (10+2) Examination in Science / Arts / Commerce under SEBA/AHSEC/CBSE with at least 45% are eligible to apply.

Admission to the college is strictly on the basis of merit. But there is reservation for candidates belonging to S.C / S.T / PWD / OBC / MOBC Categories.

The candidates selected for Degree Course must get themselves admitted on the very day of the interview. Failure to turn up at the interview will forfeit the claim for admission. The date of commencement of the new classes will be announced after the admission.

- **M.Com:** Students who qualify in the Common Entrance Test conducted by GU only can apply for M.Com Regular Courses.
- **BBA:** Candidates who pass HS (10+2) Examination in Arts, Science or Commerce under AHSEC or from any other Board or Council recognized by Gauhati University securing at least 45% marks or who pass the 3 years diploma course in Engineering recognized by the G.U with at least 50% are eligible to apply.

Students desirous to take up Major will be allowed to give three choices of subjects according to their preference and seats will be allotted accordingly. If the seats of a particular subject are filled-up then Major will be allotted in the subjects of 2nd or 3rd options as given by the student.

EXAMINATION

- All the internal and sessional examinations and assignments are a part of the university examinations and are conducted according to university guidelines. 75% attendance is compulsory to sit in the sessional and final examination.
- Any student who fails to submit assignments or does not sit for sessional exams in any paper will not pass the university examination and will be considered as arrear in the concerned subject.

FACILITIES

Library:

The College has a well-equipped digitalized central library and well-furnished reading rooms for both teachers and students.

On all working days, the reading hall remains open for students from 9 AM to 4 PM.

It has e-book and e-journal facilities for both teachers and students.

Library rules:

- Strict silence must be maintained by the students in the reading hall and the library:
- The students must bring with them their own identity card and the reader's ticket while entering library and reading hall.
- Books are issued for a period of 15 (fifteen) days against the reader's card.
- Late fee of Rs. 5/- (five) per day will be charged for the period of delay from the date given on the due date slip in the book.
- The facility may be suspended to those students who are not co-operating as per the rules of library.
- Strict action will be taken if books / furniture's are misused, damaged by the students. Any kind of discussion is forbidden inside the Library.

STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION

NEP 2020 AND NEW CURRICULUM OF GAUHATI UNIVERSITY (2023)

Structure-wise, the present Bachelor's Degree programme under the CBCS is a 3-year degree programme at the end of which, a student will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Arts, Science, or Commerce. One can also have a Bachelor's of Vocation degree, being run in some colleges, which in short form known as the B.Voc degree. The two systems – Bachelor's Course under CBCS and Bachelor's Course under the FYUGP (Four Year Under Graduate Programme) of NEP are different in the following ways.

Duration

While under CBCS, one has a 3-year degree programme, under the NEP's FYUGP; it is a 4-year degree programme.

Exits & Entries

Under CBCS, one needs to complete the full 3-year programme in order to get a degree. There is no provision for dropping out of the programme in the middle. While in the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

Honours and Major

Under the CBCS, we either have Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a regular Bachelor's Degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.

Progression

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, s/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree. Under CBCS, there was no such pathway.

Progression to Doctoral Studies

Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.

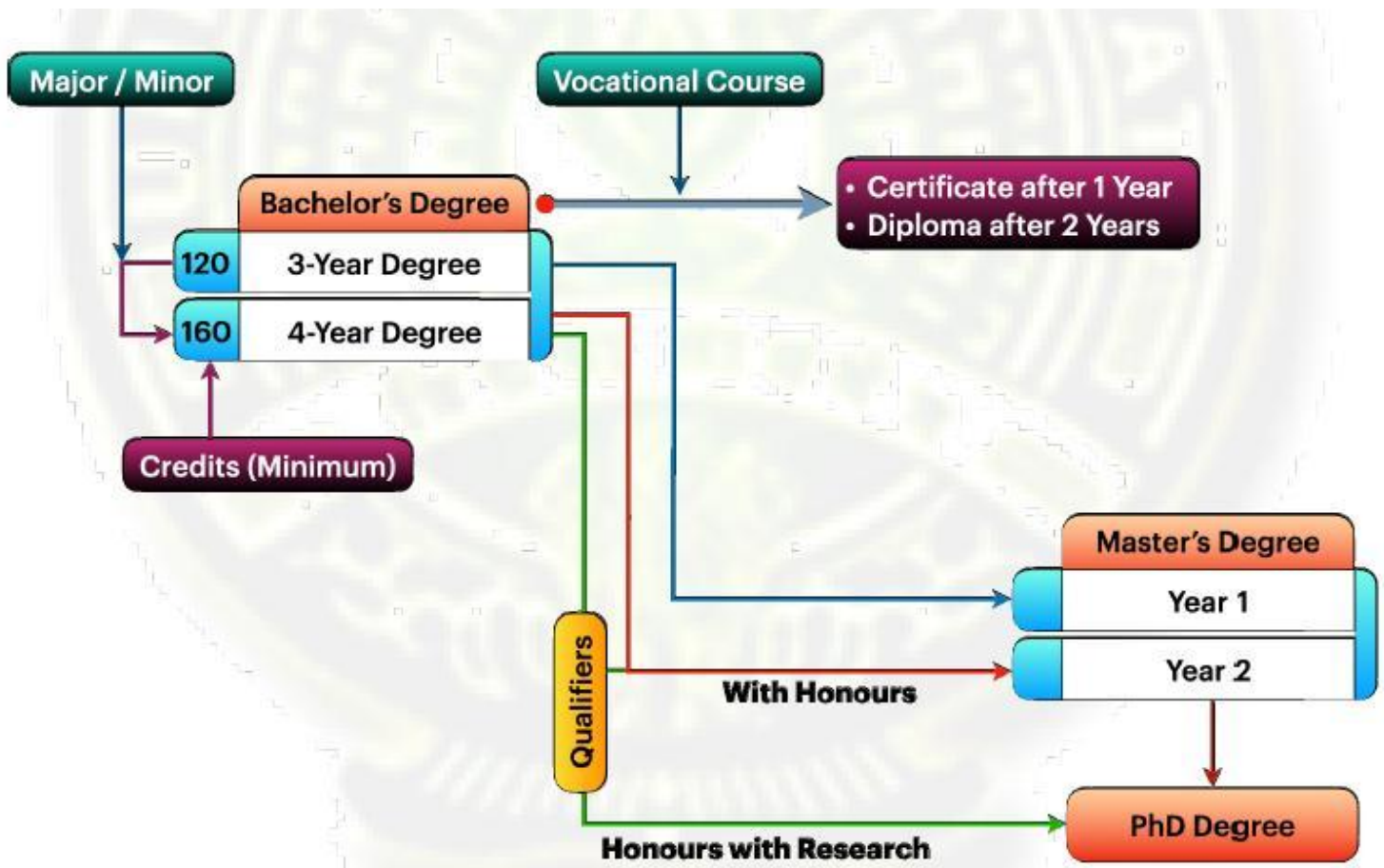


Figure 1.1: Progression under GU-FYUGP

Subject Details - Core Subjects

In this Chapter, we describe all the existing subject details, their dependencies, and prerequisites. All the subjects are broadly divided into four streams. They are:

1. Arts
2. Science
3. Commerce & Management
4. Interdisciplinary

All these streams have their own subject groups. For example, Physical Science is a subject group of Science stream. Or, Other Language is a subject group of Arts stream. These groups with their parent streams are shown in Fig.

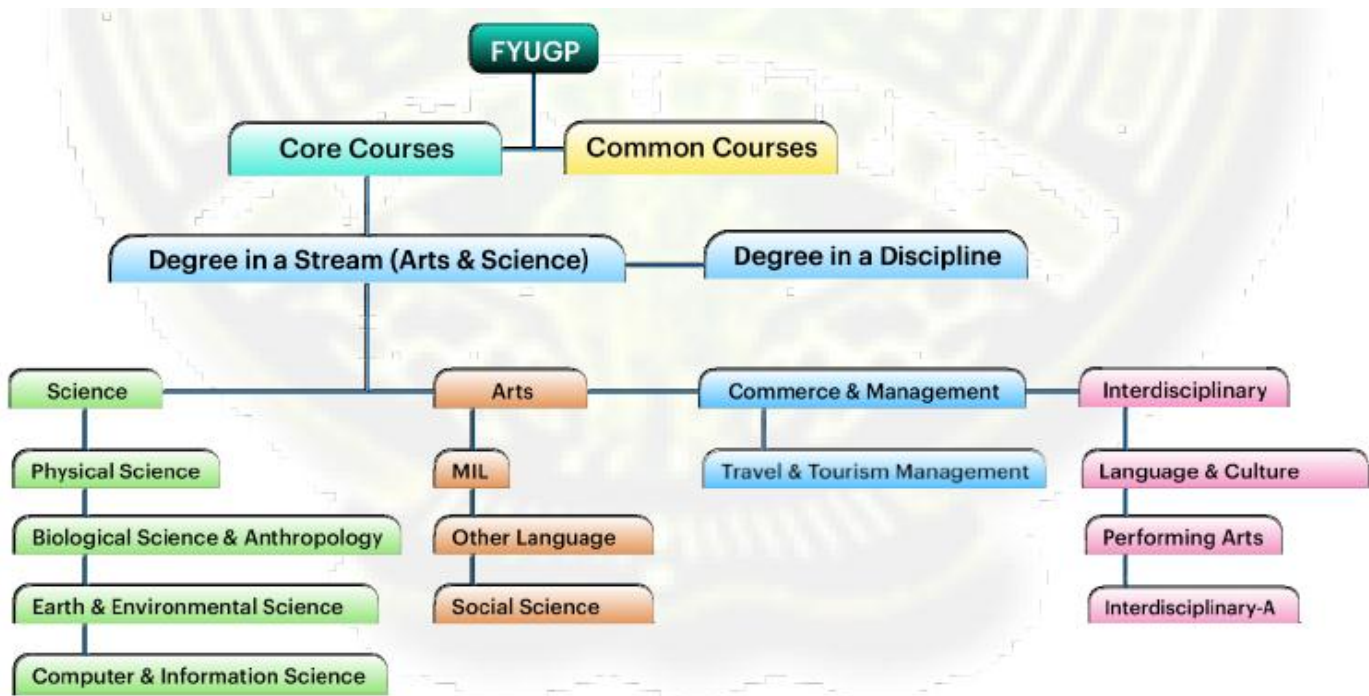


Figure: Streams and their subject groups.

All the subject groups will have a bunch of individual subjects belonging to the respective groups, which will be described in the next section. The following applies to all these groups except the group for Commerce & Management, which will be described separately.

- All groups have their own conditions and prerequisites.
- A student can combine any three subjects from these groups subject to the fulfillment of the requirements and prerequisites.

Gauhati University will release a digital utility in due course of time through which a student will be able to see what subjects can be studied under the FYUGP in GU (based on their Class XII-level subjects and preferences).

Bachelor's Degree in Commerce

The Bachelor's Degree in Commerce is a standalone course with the FYUGP structure. However, with this degree, one can have choice of Majors in (i) Accountancy, (ii) Finance, (iii) Human Resource Management, and (iv) Marketing Management. The Common Courses are same for all. Below, we show the Major options as well as the Common Courses for a Bachelor's Degree in Commerce.

1. Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and dignified manner of behavior inside as well as outside the College campus. They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the College and should act in a way that highlights the discipline and esteem of the College.
2. A six day working schedule from Monday to Saturday is followed. Classes are scheduled from 8.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.
3. All the students are expected to be present in the class well -within time.
4. No student shall enter or leave the class room when the session is on without the permission of the teacher concerned.
5. In the events of Student seminars/project presentations etc., it is compulsory that all the students of the concerned class be present for the entire session.
6. All students shall leave the college premises immediately after 4.00 p.m. No students shall wander or gather in verandah, corridor, and staircase etc.
7. All leave applications (Regular & Medical) shall be submitted in time, for sanction by HoD. Application for medical leave shall be accompanied by valid medical certificates.
8. Students shall come to the college only in approved uniforms.
9. Students shall not make any alterations to the college uniform. Any violation of this could result in suspension from the college.
10. All the students are expected to attend all college functions in college uniform unless otherwise specified.
11. All the students shall wear their identity cards, well displayed. Identity badge is a public document and any teaching staff and non-teaching staff shall have the right to peruse it.
12. Students shall not bring powered high decibel sounding vehicles inside the campus. Speed limit of 10 KM will be maintained inside the campus.
13. Students are expected to maintain silence in the academic buildings to maintain the decorum and, any deviant behavior such as hooting, whistling, loitering etc. will be treated as indiscipline.

14. For independent study, students are expected to use the class rooms, library or the demarcated areas of the academic building and shall not resort to sitting in staircases or circulation areas where they could interfere with the free movement.
15. Students are encouraged to make use of the library, common computing facilities and to involve in professional body activities or any program authorized by the college beyond class hours. However under normal circumstances students shall retreat to their hostels or residences by 5.00PM.
16. Accessing Social Networking Sites is prohibited within the classroom; however access to these sites are permitted in hostel building during time slots specified by the hostel wardens. Cellphones can be used in classroom for academic purpose with permission.
17. Students must keep the campus neat and clean. Do not put any waste anywhere in the campus except in the waste baskets kept. Any violation of this shall invite disciplinary action.
18. Consumption of intoxicants / psychotropic substances in any form or smoking or using chewing- gum, gutka, panmasala etc. are strictly prohibited.
19. It is strongly advised to refrain from activities such as scribbling or noting on walls, door or furniture which could deface the college and destroy the academic ambiance.
20. In the event of damage of property, the responsible students will have to bear the cost of replacement/repair with fine.
21. Students are not permitted to arrange any unauthorized celebrations and decorations of any magnitude in the campus.
22. Students are not permitted to distribute or display (both physically and electronically) material such as notices, banners, religious symbols and signs etc. in the campus without the permission of the competent authority.
23. Students who intend to represent the college in intercollegiate events shall take prior permission from the concerned head of the department and the selection will be based on parameters such as academic performance, attendance, character, existing academic pressure and competence of the student in the proposed event for participation.
24. During examinations, students are not allowed to leave the hall within one hour from the beginning of the exam, and students have to occupy the seat 5 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
25. The College Union will be formed as per Lyngdoh Committee recommendations approved by the Honorable Supreme Court of India. It will be based on a parliamentary (indirect) system given in Section No.6.2.4 of Lyngdoh Committee recommendations.

26. Political activity in any form is not permitted in the College campus. Unauthorized meetings, propaganda work, processions or fund collections are forbidden within the College, hostels, and outside the college.

27. Harassing juniors, ill treatment to other fellow students or any such form of ragging is objectionable and liable to be treated as criminal offence by the law enforcing agencies as per the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

28. Misbehavior towards girl students, use of threat or violence against members of the staff or fellow students will be considered as very serious cases of misconduct.

29. Students must pay fees, mess bills etc. in time.

30. Any violation of the above rules will invite penalty in the form of warning, fine, inviting guardians or any course of corrective measure as found suitable by the concerned staff member or higher authority of the College.

What constitutes ragging?

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs their regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- f) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- g) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any

other student.

- h) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in their commendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
 - The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
 - i) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - j) With-holding / with drawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
 - k) Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
 - l) With-holding results.
 - m) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - n) Suspension / expulsion from the hostel.
 - o) Cancellation of admission.
 - p) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
 - q) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
 - Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
 - An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie,

- a) in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice- Chancellor of the University;
 - b) in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor,
 - c) in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancel or of the institution, as the case may be.
- Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faculty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude to wards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faulty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that maybe taken under the penal laws for abetment of ragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.
