COURSES OF STUDY: Under Graduate FYUGP (UGFYUGP) Programmes / NEP-2020 Programme under G.U.

The college offers the following Courses:

- 1. B. Com.(Semester system with major/honours in Accountancy, Finance and Management under Gauhati University and FYUGP of NEP-2020).
- 2. BBA (3 years semester course under Gauhati University) (FYUGP of NEP-2020)

Post Graduate (PG) Course:

M.Com. (Two years semester course under Gauhati University).

Provided that:

- i) After completion of 3 year degree course, a student can take admission in 1st Year
 M. Com. and study 2 years course (4 Semesters) as per course under G.U.
- ii) After completion of 4 year degree course, a student can get admitted directly in 2nd Year M. Com. (3rd Semester) Programme and study for one year (2 Semesters) as per NEP-2020.

- 1. Tourism and Travel Management (3 months)
- 2. Insurance Marketing (3 months)
- 3. Soft Skill and Personal development (3 months)
- **4.** Interview Strategies (3 months)
- 5. Yoga Fundamental Course (3 months)

- 7. Sales and Marketing Management (6 months).

NB: The Add-on Courses are approved by the Academic Council of the college.

ADMISSION

(For attention of Guardians and Students)

- Please go through the prospectus carefully before signing the Admission Form.
- Students will be selected strictly on the basis of merit.
- Seats are reserved for students belonging to SC / ST / MOBC / OBC / Physically handicapped as per govt. Rules.
- Admission to the College Hostel will be on the basis of merit after the college admission.
- The following documents should be produced at the time of admission:
 - i. Original Mark sheet, Certificate of the last qualifying examination, Caste Certificate, Gap Certificate if any. (Provisional certificate will not be accepted)
 - ii. Income certificate of parents must be produced if opting for free admission scheme of Assam government. The said certificate must be issued by the **Circle office / Revenue Branch**.
- Filling up the registration form immediately after the admission is mandatory for registration under G.U.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- **B.Com:** Candidates who has passed H.S. (10+2) Examination in Science / Arts / Commerce under SEBA/AHSEC/CBSE with at least 45% are eligible to apply.
 - Admission to the college is strictly on the basis of merit. But there is reservation for candidates belonging to SC / ST / PWD / OBC / MOBC Categories.
 - The candidates selected for Degree Course must get themselves admitted on the very day of the interview. Failure to turn up at the interview will forfeit the claim for admission. The date of commencement of the new classes will be announced after the admission.
- **M.Com**: Students who are qualified in the Common Entrance Test conducted by GU only can apply for M.Com Regular Courses.
- **BBA**: Candidates who has passed HS (10+2) Examination in Arts, Science or Commerce under AHSEC or from any other Board or Council recognized by Gauhati University securing at least 45% marks or who pass the 3 years diploma course in Engineering recognized by the G.U with at least 50% are eligible to apply.

Students desirous to take up Major will be allowed to give three choices of subjects according to their preference and seats will be allotted accordingly. If the seats of a particular subject are filled-up then Major will be allotted in the subjects of 2nd or 3rd preference as given by the student.

EXAMINATION

- All the internal and sessional examinations and assignments are a part of the university examinations and are conducted according to university guidelines. However 75% class attendance is compulsory to sit in the sessional and final examination.
- Any student who fails to submit assignments or does not sit for sessional exams in any paper
 will not pass the university examination and will be considered as arrear in the concerned
 subject.

FACILITIES

Library:



The College has a well-equipped digitalized central library and well-furnished reading rooms for both teachers and students. On all working days, the reading hall remains open for students from 9 AM to 4 PM. It has e-book and e-journal facilities for both teachers and students.

Library rules:

- Strict silence must be maintained by the students in the reading hall and the library:
- The students must bring with them their own identity card and the reader's ticket while entering library and reading hall.
- Books are issued for a period of 15 (fifteen) days against the reader's card.
- Late fee of Rs. 5/- (five) per day will be charged for the period of delay from the date given on the due date slip in the book.
- The facility may be suspended to those students who are not co-operating as per the rules of library.
- Strict action will be taken if books / furniture's are misused, damaged by the students. Any kind of discussion is forbidden inside the Library.

NEP 2020 AND NEW CURRICULUM OF GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

Structure-wise, the present Bachelor's Degree programme under the FYUGP is a 3-year degree programme at the end of which, a student will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Arts, Science, or Commerce. One can also have a Bachelor's of Vocation degree, being run in some colleges, which in short form known as the B.Voc degree. The two systems – Bachelor's Course under FYUGP and Bachelor's Course under the FYUGP (Four Year Under Graduate Pragramme) of NEP are different in the following ways.

Duration

While under FYUGP, one has a 3-year degree programme, under the NEP's FYUGP; it is a 4-year degree programme.

Exits & Entries

Under FYUGP, one needs to complete the 3-year programme in order to get a degree. There is no provision for dropping out of the programme midway. While in the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years.

If he/she exits the programme:

- i) After one year, he/she gets a certificate,
- ii) After two years, he/she gets a diploma,
- iii) After three years, he/she gets a Bachelor's Degree
- iv) Finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, he/she gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

Honours and Major


Under the FYUGP, we either have Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a regular Bachelor's Degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.

Progression

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, he/she will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year programme. However, if a student completes an FYUGP, he/she needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree.

Progression to Doctoral Studies

Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if he/she has an exceptionally remarkable career progression one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.

Subject Details - Core Subjects

In this Chapter, we describe all the existing subject details, their dependencies, and prerequisites. All the subjects are broadly divided into four streams. They are:

- 1. Arts
- 2. Science
- 3. Commerce & Management
- 4. Interdisciplinary

All these streams have their own subject groups. For example, Physical Science is a subject group of Science stream. Or, Other Language is a subject group of Arts stream. These groups with their parent streams are shown in Fig.




Figure: Streams and their subject groups.

All the subject groups will have a bunch of individual subjects belonging to the respective groups, which will be described in the next section. The following applies to all these groups except the group for Commerce & Management, which will be described separately.

- All groups have their own conditions and prerequisites.
- A student can combine any three subjects from these groups subject to the fulfillment of the requirements and prerequisites.

Gauhati University will release a digital utility in due course of time through which a student will be able to see what subjects can be studied under the FYUGP in GU (based on their Class XII-level subjects and preferences).

Bachelor's Degree in Commerce

The Bachelor's Degree in Commerce is a standalone course with the FYUGP structure. However, with this degree, one can have choice of Majors in (i) Accountancy, (ii) Finance, (iii) Human Resource Management, and (iv) Marketing Management. The Common Courses are same for all. Below, we show the Major options as well as the Common Courses for a Bachelor's Degree in Commerce.

RESULTS UNDER NEP

A candidate shall be awarded Certificates and Degrees as given below:

- 1. On Completion of one year Course, he/she will get Certificate. (It has 2 semesters.)
- 2. On Completion of 2 years Course, he/she will get Diploma. (It has 4 Semesters.)
- 3. On Completion of 3 years Course, he/she will get Bachelor Degree with Major. (It has 6 Semesters).
- 4. On Completion of 4 years Course, he/she will get Bachelor Degree with Honours. (It has 8 Semesters.)
- 5. After completion of 3 years Degree Course, he/she may get admission in 2 years Master Degree Course where they must complete 4 Semesters.

RESEARCH PROJECT REPORT

The College provides an opportunity to the students to conduct Research in different fields. The students shall conduct their Research Project and submit the "Project Report" to their respective guides within 3 months of an academic session. The Report shall be prepared under the guidance of a teacher who shall be referred to as the Guide of the Project.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (A) All powers of maintaining discipline are vested with the Principal and his decisions shall be final in all matters. The Principal also reserves the right in modifying the rules and regulations made by the College, as and when necessary.
- (B) All the departments of the College (including library) will function according to rules made by the Principal from time to time.
- (C) Students must observe silence in the College premises. They must not loiter in passage and college corridors during class hours.
- (D) Students must be punctual in attendance and must be on their seats at the commencement of lectures. Seat will be forfeited if a student in any semester remains absent less than 75% and his or her name will be deleted from the register automatically. As such student cannot claim the seat without prior valid reason. Any leave for the student must be taken from the Principal prior to the leave. For Medical Leave, Medical Certificate needs to be submitted at the earliest. Any representative from the family of the student can submit leave application with supporting documents.
- (E) No Society or Association of the students will be started without the permission of the Principal. The societies and associations shall be subjects to such guidance and control as the college administration may prescribe from time to time.
- (F) All notices desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the College premises shall require the approval of the Principal.
- (G) No person shall be invited to address or entertain in the College without prior permission of the Principal
- (H) Subject for debate or items of entertainment by the students in the College premise must be approved by the Principal. A responsible person approved or nominated by the Principal shall be in the chair at all College debate and social functions.
- (I) The College reserves the right to expel any student at any time for any reason deemed by the Principal as misbehavior in the campus of the institution.
- (J) The Principal reserves the right to remove the name of any student from attendance register for failure to pay the institute's dues in time.
- (K) Students are required to show due regard for rights and properties of the institution. Any student found guilty of tampering/damaging the property shall be punishable and may be liable to expulsion from the College.
- (L) Student must ensure that they have at least 75% attendance in the class without which they will not be qualified to attend the final examination.
- (M) **RAGGING** is a criminal offence. Any kind of Ragging is strictly prohibited both inside and outside the campus.
- (N) The UGC Regulations on Curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions,2009 shall be strictly followed in the college.

What constitutes ragging?

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs there regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- f) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- g) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- h) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in there commendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
- i) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- j) With-holding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.

- k) Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
- 1) With-holding results.
- m) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- n) Suspension / expulsion from the hostel.
- o) Cancellation of admission.
- p) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- q) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
 - Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
 - Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faculty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faulty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that maybe taken under the penal laws for abetment of ragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.


