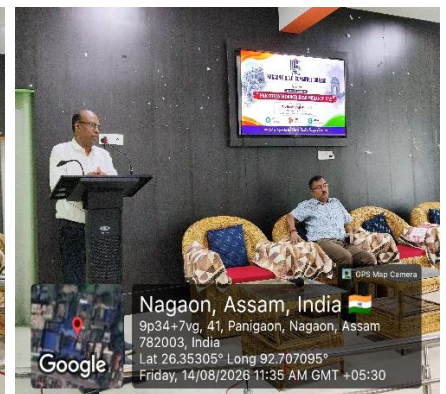


HAR GHAR TIRANGA RALLY AND PARTITION HORROR REMEMBRANCE DAY OBSERVED AT NAGAON G.N.D.G. COMMERCE COLLEGE

On the eve of the **80th Independence Day**, Nagaon G.N.D.G. Commerce College observed the occasion with a **Sensitization Rally under the “Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign”** on 14th August, 2026. The rally was flagged off by the Principal of the College, **Dr. Mriganka Saikia**, and witnessed enthusiastic participation from teaching and non-teaching staff and students. The rally, organised by the **NCC and NSS Units of the College**, was aimed at paying homage to the **freedom fighters of India** and expressing gratitude for their exemplary lives, immense contributions and sacrifices for the nation. Members of the college union body and other students also participated actively in the rally, which carried the message of patriotism, national unity and respect for the national flag. Following the rally, the College organized a **flag distribution programme**, under which the National Flag was distributed among residents of the nearby locality as part of the **Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign**. The initiative sought to encourage citizens to display the Tricolour with pride and strengthen the spirit of patriotism and national integration.

Later, the College organized a **Lecture Programme on “Partition Horror Remembrance Day”** to commemorate the tragic events and human suffering associated with the Partition of India. The programme was inaugurated by Principal **Dr. Mriganka Saikia**, who, in his inaugural address, spoke about the devastating impact of Partition on the lives of people and the immense human suffering caused during that period.

Before the lecture, the teaching and non-teaching staff and students of the College watched a short video clip highlighting the horrors and human consequences of Partition. **Mr. Rayhanul Ahmed, HoD and Associate Professor, Department of History, Khagarijan College**, attended the programme as the Guest Speaker. In his address, Mr. Ahmed elaborated on the traumatic experiences of people during Partition, with particular emphasis on the severe impact of the violence and displacement on **women and children**. He highlighted the importance of remembering the painful history of Partition so that future generations can learn from the consequences of communal violence, hatred and division. The programme was anchored by **Prof. Bhupesh Tumung, Assistant Professor, Department of Assamese**. The observance of the day concluded with a renewed commitment to uphold the values of **unity, peace, patriotism and national integrity**.
